



Deadlines: Deadlines for filings in the Court of Appeals of Georgia are no longer tolled by the Statewide Judicial Emergency [Orders](#) of the Supreme Court of Georgia. See the Supreme Court [website](#) for more details. As always, parties may request motions for extensions of time as set forth in Court of Appeals [Rule 16](#).

Operations: The Court of Appeals remains fully operational. Sufficient personnel remain on site during business hours to process paper filings from pro se parties and to handle any other business that cannot be completed remotely.

Admissions: All attorney admissions are being conducted remotely, at the on-site admission fee rate. For directions on remote admissions, click [here](#). Typically, attorneys requesting remote admissions via e-mail during business hours are admitted within twenty minutes. No on-site attorney admissions will be conducted at the Court until further notice.
